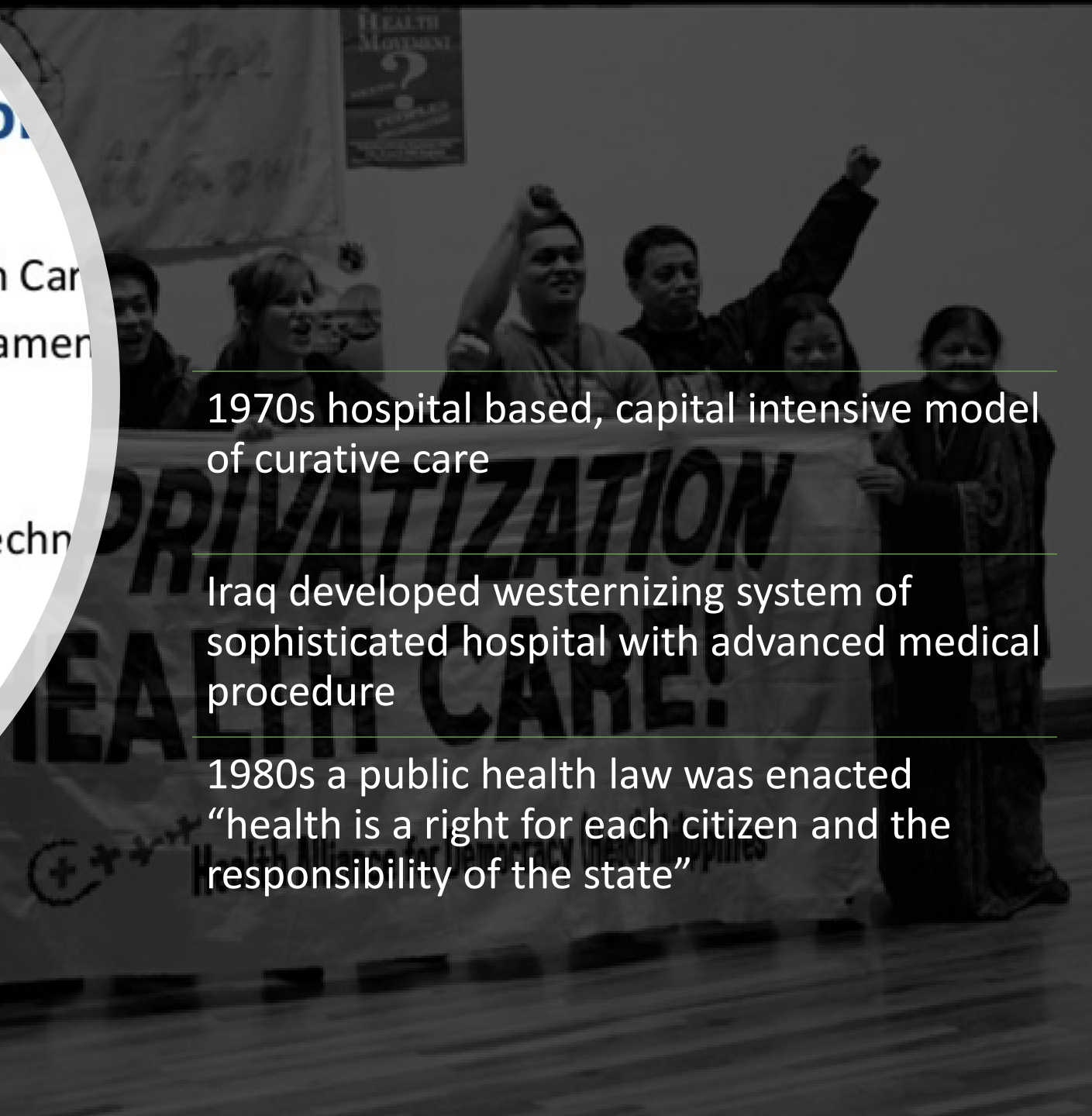
Alma Ata, 1978:

International Conference on Primary Health Care calls for urgent action by development workers, and the world community to protect the health of the people of the world by the year 2000.

1970s hospital based, capital intensive model of curative care

Iraq developed westernizing system of sophisticated hospital with advanced medical procedure

1980s a public health law was enacted  
“health is a right for each citizen and the responsibility of the state”

# Global Conference on Primary Health Care

From Alma-Ata towards universal health coverage  
and the Sustainable Development Goals

**Astana, Kazakhstan, 25 and 26 October 2018**

We, Heads of State and Government, ministers and representatives of States and Governments<sup>1</sup>, participating in the Global Conference on Primary Health Care: From Alma-Ata towards universal health coverage and the Sustainable Development Goals, meeting in Astana on 25 and 26 October 2018, reaffirming the commitments expressed in the ambitious and visionary Declaration of Alma-Ata of 1978 and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, in pursuit of Health for All, hereby make the following Declaration.

## We envision

**Governments and societies** that prioritize, promote and protect people's health and well-being, at both population and individual levels, through strong health systems;

**Primary health care and health services** that are high quality, safe, comprehensive, integrated, accessible, available and affordable for everyone and everywhere, provided with compassion, respect and dignity by health professionals who are well-trained, skilled, motivated and committed;

**Enabling and health-conducive environments** in which individuals and communities are empowered and engaged in maintaining and enhancing their health and well-being;

**Partners and stakeholders** aligned in providing effective support to national health policies, strategies and plans.

## The success of primary health care will be driven by:

**Knowledge and capacity-building.** We will apply knowledge, including scientific as well as traditional knowledge, to strengthen PHC, improve health outcomes and ensure access for all people to the right care at the right time and at the most appropriate level of care, respecting their rights, needs, dignity and autonomy. We will continue to research and share knowledge and experience, build capacity and improve the delivery of health services and care.

**Human resources for health.** We will create decent work and appropriate compensation for health professionals and other health personnel working at the primary health care level to respond effectively to people's health needs in
